- 1. Quorum:** Vice-Chairman, Dr. Arthur Goldberg determined quorum was present.
- 2. Minutes:** The minutes of the previous Board Meeting (8/22/13) were accepted. Motion by Randall Ledy, second by Maria Magana, to accept the minutes. The motion unanimously carried.
- 3. Fund Status:** Vanessa Helms stated that the program has so far spent \$201,035.49 in benefit expenses. We have been reimbursed from ACJC \$138,460.07 so far, though since it has not yet cleared finance, this reimbursement does not current show on our funds spreadsheet. We are being reimbursed quarterly for our administrative expenses and have now been reimbursed \$17,275.00 for the first quarter allotment. The total funds that remain for the year are \$448,377.51. Vanessa stated that expenses are more per board meeting than normal but the restitution and subrogation accounts are healthy and we continue to receive deposits in both accounts and can utilize those for benefit expenses as needed. Vanessa has sent an email to ACJC regarding options for fund allocation should the program continue to have expenses at the current rate and will update the Board as more information is gathered. Maria Magana asked why the expenses are more as of late. Vanessa stated that we have been receiving more claims and requests that previously. Vanessa also stated that once the Affordable Health Care Act goes into effect, this may affect the expenses as well.

**4. Staff Updates:**

**A. National Conference Re-Cap:** This item was deferred to the end of the meeting for timing purposes and then was deferred to the next Board meeting.

**B. Crime Related Counseling Needs Assessment Extensions on Discussion:** Vanessa indicated that from this point forward, the Board will see more CRCNA-

Extensions on the discussion agenda. The reason for this is that when there are additional sessions required and it may be the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> extension request, Vanessa would like the Board members who have specific experience in the mental health field to be able to provide specific feedback on the appropriateness of the extensions.

**C. Contributory Conduct Handout** – Vanessa will provide this handout at the next Board Meeting. However, she indicated that she has slightly edited the recommendations around contributory conduct which are now broken down into two sections. 1. Did the victim’s conduct contribute to his or her injuries? If the Board member can answer yes to that then they must then ask, did the conduct cause the crime? If the answer to both is “yes” then contributory conduct can be established. If no to either, then contributory conduct cannot be considered.
